If anyone has been hiding under a rock somewhere, or out of the country, the news that the National Archery Championships were held in Brisbane - at Mount Petrie Bowmen's Belmont range and at Grange's Samford range between 23rd to 27th May, may come as a surprise.

However, it did happen, and members of the Grange Company of Target Archers generally did very well in their various groups.

In the Men's Recurve class, Rod Brier-Mills scored 2270 for two FITA rounds and ranked 12th, and Mike Schilling scored 1971, and ranked 24th.

In the Women's Recurve class, Shelley Allsopp scored 1969, and ranked 16th.

On Saturday 18th June, at the Club, both Mike and Shelley received FITA stars for 1000+ rounds in the Nationals.

In the Recurve Master Men class, Alan Roberts scored 2077 and ranked 5th. Patrick Barden ranked 5th with a score of 2097 in the Veteran Men's Recurve class.

In the Recurve Barebow Master Men's class lan Smith ranked second with a score of 1612, in the Recurve Barebow Veteran Men's class Dave Arrowsmith scored 1692 and ranked 2nd, and Jim Gooley ranked first, with a score of 1857, in the Veteran Men's Compound Barebow.

Scott Hagaman and Tristan Barrett (Men's Compound) scored 2639 (ranking 12th) and 2600 (ranking 22nd), respectively.

Madeline Ferris (Women's Compound) scored 2679 and ranked 10th. and Neil Digweed (Veteran Men's Compound) followed up with a 2nd ranking 2786.

So that was the **Target Championships**.

In the Field Championships, out of a possible 900, Scott Hagaman (Compound, Men) scored 755 and ranked 9th, Madeline Ferris (Compound, Women) scored 745 and ranked 2nd, and Neil Digweed (Compound, Veteran Men) scored 755 and ranked Number 1 (so age does weary them?)

Rod Brier-Mills (Men's Recurve) ended up ranking 8th with a score of 636, and Alan Roberts (Recurve Masters Men) achieved a 4th ranking with a score of 468.

lan Smith (Barebow Master Men) ranked number 1 with a score of 342.

So that was the **Field Championships**, where a walk through the bush is spoiled by having to stop and fire arrows at targets - sometimes


The Clout Championships were held at the Samford Archery Park on 27th May, the last day of the Championships. Scores are out of a possible 600 - a Double Clout.

Mike Schilling (Men's Recurve) ranked 4th with a score of 503, Madeline Ferris (Women's Compound), 4th with a score of 573, and lan Smith (Barebow Master Men) ranked number one with 447.

Dave Arrowsmith and Patrick Barden fought out the Barebow Veteran Men's Clout and Dave ranked number one with 472, as against Patrick's number two ranking following a score of 387. Greg Jackson with 345 ranked third in the Longbow Master Men class.

Kynan Schilling ended ranking second, with a score of 399 in the Men's Longbow Clout, and Jim Gooley (Veteran Men's Barebow Compound) came in number one with 460 scored.

SAFETY WARNING

Mike Schilling, Field Captain, wants to remind everyone that the target butts should be <u>anchored down</u> at the back, using tent pegs, when placed on the open field.

When it is not windy, we tend to forget this point, but when it IS windy, as recently happened, target butts can blow over, and it may be YOUR arrows that break.

Some of the target frames have holes in the back legs for pegs, others may need to be anchored by lengths of rope until holemaking is completed.

Please make every effort to develop the habit of anchoring the target butts.

Club Championship rankings to June.

The list of Club Championships is on the notice board at the Club grounds for more detail, but currently leading in the compound bow class is Scott Hagaman, rather closely followed by Hayden Millis.



Hayden hasn't been shooting for very long (said from the point of view of someone who has been "archerying" since 1959, and still hasn't gone higher than 2nd class archer), but he is currently shooting Grand Master Bowman levels in some of the ranges.

Ian Smith currently leads the recurve division, and Kynan Schilling leads in the Longbow shoots.

Target Captain versus Director Of Shooting (DOS)

When there is only one target on a shooting line a "Target Captain" is appointed to control shooting. Verbal directions about shooting, ceasing shooting and collecting arrows, may be sufficient, although whistles/buzzers could be used.

When there is more than one target in use on a shooting line, the DOS controls shooting. The DOS carries a yellow flag, and a whistle or buzzer is used for signaling, although verbal commands can also be involved.

One whistle blast/buzzer noise means it is safe to commence shooting, three blasts/buzzes means it is safe to proceed forward to collect arrows. More than 3 blasts indicates an emergency situation

In cases of urgency anyone on the line can call "hold" or "hold fast" and shooting must immediately cease.

"Safety is our absolute priority"

Trolling through the Archery Australia web site (it can be easily reached from the Grange website) can take a while, but there is some interesting information to be had.

For instance, there are lists of record holders - World records, National Championship records and Australian Tournament records.

Two Club members hold, or have held World archery records - Madeline Ferris and Rod Brier-Mills.



In fact, Rod received his record acknowledgement, dated June 2010, at the Australian National Championships which have just been held.
