## **Message from Club President**

With winter upon us Covid and influenza are on the rise in the community. I hope that all members are faring well. However just as a reminder to help you and fellow members stay safe, please feel free to wear a mask particularly indoors or when you cannot socially distance, please sanitise hands often, sanitise common use equipment before and after use - like the target handles or hire bows - and please draw your own arrows. If unwell, please do not come to the club. These simple measures will help keep you, your family, and friends safe.



It has been a trying year in several ways with the extremes of wet weather that hit eastern Australia. While the club did not get damaged by flooding, the target fields have been thoroughly soaked for a long time, and we thank the unbelievable efforts of the mowing crew to restore them.

The club in concert with South Queensland Archery Society will be hosting the National Target Championships 2022 from 29 September to 3 October 2022 at Samford. This will be a fantastic event to participate in or to proudly help make it happen and an EOI to host the event again in 2023 has been submitted. This is the premier national Archery Australia tournament. This year it is being trialled in a new format that combines all the target archery and open Matchplay elements into one event and includes under 18 and under 21 age classes. There are three elements - short range 900 rounds, a WA1440 round and 720 ranking rounds for the Matchplay competitions. The Matchplay competitions will include both team Matchplay and individual Matchplay. The Matchplay includes compound, recurve, and bare bow recurve. There is serious prize money, bows and sets of arrows up for grabs. Live streaming is also being arranged by Archery Australia and depending on costs, at the least, the filming is planned to include the individual Matchplay and finals. So far, we have over 360 entries in the three elements. Entries for the Nationals close on 31 August and places are limited so if you are considering entering, please do so soon. We are also on the lookout for volunteers so if you are able to help in any way, please see me or Alison.

The club sincerely thanks the Wednesday afternoon working bee volunteers that have put in an enormous effort to prepare the grounds and equipment ready for the Nationals. The Moreton Bay Regional Council is a major supporter of the Nationals, as is Pats Archery, Hoyt, Easton and Archery Australia.

The club has been very successful this year with being awarded several large grants for capital works which include installation of some subsurface drainage to the Mid Field and West Field and some levelling with the works costing approximately \$100k, extending the pipe to fill in the drain near the "bridge" with the works costing \$20k, for the purchase of target butts approximately \$35k, and for the hosting of the Nationals \$10k. These improvement works follow the club's strategic plan.

During the installation of the subsurface drainage, which is expected to take two weeks in October or November, there will be significant barrier fencing in please restricting archery to the Indoors and he East Field. Workplace health and safety requirements of the contractor will be in force, with open trenches and heavy machinery working unfettered on the Mid Field and West Field. While this will be a disruption to everybody's archery the drainage works should improve the availability of the fields that have been out of action regularly this year.

While grants enable capital improvements to be undertaken at the club, we have to fund our operational costs and unfortunately our operating costs are rising. Target face costs have particularly escalated, but as we all know so has everything else. Accordingly, the committee has reluctantly decided on a small rise in the day shooting fee from \$4 to \$5, however the alternative weekly range fee will remain unchanged at \$10, and the bow hire fee staying at \$10.

As we are in the lead up to the Nationals it is expected that the Target QRE on Sunday 21 August will be popular. The next major SQAS tournament coming up at the club is the SQAS Short Range Championships on 17 and 18 September 2022.

I would also like to sincerely thank our coaches without whom the club would be much less successful. We welcomed Darren Brack on board as the new Club Coach, and this year he was also appointed by SQAS as the SQAS Coaching Coordinator. A major task first up that confronted Darren was getting all our instructors and coaches transferred over to the new Archery Australia L1 and L2 coaches. Thankfully, we are now in a good position to continue with operations in 2023 as without completing these courses, coaches would not be covered by Archery Australia insurance.

In conclusion, thank you to all our members and volunteers who help to make the club the great place that it is.

Archery Australia works in conjunction with RGB's to deliver a program that supports athletes that demonstrate a commitment and drive to be internationally competitive.

- compete domestically and internationally.



#### **Understanding the AA athlete pathway**

Archery Australia's Athlete pathway defines the journey an athlete may take towards international success.

Access to the pathway begins from club and state level (Green step) and moves onto the AARDP program (white step).

At the AARDP level archers must shoot the MQS and apply to the program. It is the first step in AA's pathway that is led by AA's HP team.



SVTA has a number of archers who are placed in either the SQAS RDP, AA RDP and National Team Selection tiers.

## **Coaching Corner**

At Samford Valley Target Archers we are lucky enough to have over 20 Archery Australia accredited coaches from Levels 1, 2 and 3. This has allowed us to run a beginner's course on the first Saturday of each month and to follow it up with an induction day the following Saturday. It is great to see such an interest in our sport. These courses are booked out well in advance.

But our coaches aren't just for the benefit of the beginners. Archers of every level can benefit. Our mid field area has a coach rostered on every Saturday morning and as well as casting an eye over the relatively new archers and helping to reinforce their newly acquired skills they are also available for general questions and coaching.

These guys and girls are experienced archers and if what you want to know is above their level of expertise, they will happily direct you to a Level 2 coach. Fortunately, we have Level 2 coaches experienced in all bow types so I'm sure we can find a coach to fit you.

If you are starting to look at buying your own equipment, please see a Level 2 coach first. They will gladly assist you to ensure you are actually purchasing gear that is suitable for you.

If you are serious about becoming a competitive archer, a number of our Level 2 coaches are also willing to take on individual archers. This involves a collaboration between the coach and archer where goals are discussed and training plans devised, as well as working on corrective actions to polish up your archery form. If you think this is something that might suit you, come see me and we will see if we can work something out.

As you would have read in the weekly emails, in the lead up to the AA Nationals we have been conducting a Saturday morning coaching clinic on the west field for archers who are intending to shoot the nationals. If you would like to attend, feel free to see Alison or myself.




When and why did you become an Archer?

## What advice would you give to budding Archers?

Advise for any budding archer is "Get a Coach". The sooner you are getting coaching the sooner you will improve, and if you want to get better you must shoot more than once a week.

And finally, can you share an interesting fact about yourself? I started archery in 2010 but had 2011 off due to flood damage at Centenary, I came back in 2012 started getting coaching from Lynette Rankin and made my first World Cup team in 2013. Since then, I have represented Aus. a total of 10 times thus far.
